Mayor Koen extended a special welcome to the new Ambassadors and their spouses. "You all represent beautiful countries with an interesting history. As a diplomat and highest ranking representative of your country in The Netherlands you have an important job. I hope you will succeed in your mission and learn a lot from the Dutch during your stay and the many receptions you visit," according to the Mayor. Mayor Koen further elaborated on the appeal of living in Wassenaar, mentioning it ranks number 6 in the Top-10 best places to live in The Netherlands, with its lush green surroundings, vicinity to the

beach and dunes and boasting a number of good restaurants. Moreover he noted the excellent education opportunities available in Wassenaar, such as the American School, the Indonesian School and the British School in nearby Voorschoten. Briefly touching on cultural activities in Wassenaar, such as the local cinema, library and the Modern Art Museum Voorschoten, he concluded his remarks by wishing the Ambassadors and their families an enjoyable stay in The Netherlands and advised them to learn to ride the bicycle in order to avoid parking problems.
